Mr. Neil Bush is the third of five children of President and Mrs. George H.W. Bush. He and his wife Maria live in Houston, Texas and have six children.

Mr. Bush has been involved with energy and international business development for three decades beginning in 1980 where he worked with Amoco Production Company (now BP) in Denver, Colorado. During the decade of the 1980s Mr. Bush formed two independent oil companies which explored for oil in various states including Wyoming, Colorado, California, and Michigan and in Argentina.

For the past fifteen years Mr. Bush has engaged in various international business development activities with a focus on China and the Middle East. Mr. Bush first visited China in 1976 when his father was the Chief Liaison Officer representing the United States in Beijing. His business and personal interests in promoting his father's legacy support for closer ties between the United States and China have allowed for many return trips over the years. Mr. Bush has traveled to at least twenty cities in China and has worked with numerous entities on a variety of projects including real estate development, automobile parts, sheet rock manufacturing, and paint production. Currently Mr. Bush works in China as shareholder and Co-Chairman of CIIC, a Beijing based real estate company with hotel, industrial park, and property management assets. In addition Mr. Bush works closely with Shougang Holdings to promote mining and steel mill operations in Africa and with Sinopec to develop oil opportunities globally.

Mr. Bush is working with local partners to facilitate investments of Chinese individuals and companies in the United States oil and gas business to take advantage of the favorable buying conditions created by lower oil prices and tight credit.

Mr. Bush graduated from Tulane University with a bachelor's degree in International Economics and from the Tulane University Freeman School of Business with a Masters in Business Administration. He serves as the Chairman of the Points of Light Institute, and serves on the boards of the Houston Salvation Army, Volunteer Houston, The Fay School, and the Bush School of Government and Public Service.
